Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ,

"Shock and Awe" is a military strategy designed to use overwhelming force to quickly and decisively strike with power in order to paralyze the enemy's perception of the battle and crush their will to fight back. It is a precise attack

meant to quite literally shock and awe your enemy into submission. Such strategy has been often employed throughout history as a way to exert one nation's power and dominance over another.

But as we once again turn our hearts toward the events of Holy Week, Good Friday and Easter, we encounter an entirely other use of power which is far more shocking and awesome! In John 13:1-5, it says: 13 It was just before the Passover Festival. Jesus knew that the hour had come for Him to leave this world and go to the Father. Having loved His own who were in the world, He loved them to the end.² The evening meal was in progress, and the devil had already prompted Judas, the son of Simon Iscariot, to betray Jesus. ³ Jesus knew that the Father had put all things under His power, and that He had come from God and was returning to God; ⁴ so He got up from the meal, took off his outer clothing, and wrapped a towel around His waist. ⁵ After that, He poured water into a basin and began to wash His disciples' feet, drying them with the towel that was wrapped around Him.

All things were under Jesus' power! He possessed the power to do whatever He wanted! What would you do if you had that kind of power?

What did Jesus do? He loved His disciples unashamedly to the end! He stripped off His robe and laid aside the symbol of His honor as their Lord and Teacher! He picked up a towel and did the work of a slave as He washed their feet! Truly this is shock and awe! To dig deeper, He even washed His betrayer's feet! In this moment, when His hour had come, Jesus used the fullness of His power to serve and love others! This is why He came. In Mark 10:45, Jesus says, "For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve and to give His life as a ransom for many." He used all His power to serve and die on the cross to wash away our sins in His blood. Have you received Christ's sacrifice by faith and been washed by Him? If so, know that in Christ you have been set free to serve in His name and are clothed in His power to serve.

In John 13:12, after Jesus has finished washing their feet and sits back down at the table, He asks, "Do you know what I have done to you?" What a penetrating question! Ask yourself this: do you know what Jesus, your Teacher and Lord, has done for you?? I think I can say yes and no. I know He has washed me, saved me, changed my heart and empowered me for service, but I have much to learn in how to follow Him, serve Him and live in His power! I don't know Him as I ought too! Lord, keep changing my heart to serve others as you have served me!

In closing, a couple of things to consider: (1) *No one is above service* – Jesus said, "If I then, the Lord and the Teacher, washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet." (2) *No one is beyond service* – Remember, Jesus washed Judas' feet! (3) To serve is to embrace personal inconvenience in order to use power for God's glory and to serve in His name.

The shock and awe of being washed in Christ is that service itself is transformed in our hearts. In Christ, service is no longer inconvenience but love, no longer beneath me but the highest calling and no longer unpleasant work, but holy worship for God's glory! Do you know what Christ has done for you? How can you embrace Him and walk in His power to serve this month?

I hope you can join us this month as we together worship and serve our Servant King!

Thursday Night Fellowship & Bible Study






EASTER SUNDAY CELEBRATION – March 31st Easter Egg Hunt – 9:15
