Ministry of the Month:

Precious Life

CBC Regional Church prayer partner

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ, What are you intentionally doing TODAY to grow closer to Christ? To know His heart? To know Him and follow Him? To walk in His purpose? Not what are you doing tomorrow, or next week, but what are you doing TODAY?

In Scripture, Daniel served God presently. Daniel daily committed himself to three focused times of prayer, intentionally taking the time to kneel and face Jerusalem and seek the Lord. He didn't say tomorrow I'll pray, but he prayed TODAY. He was so intentional in his prayer life that even his enemies took notice. In fact, it was the only way that they could trap him! Daniel had so distinguished himself as a leader and scripture tells us that he had an extraordinary spirit – in other words, the supernatural presence of the Holy Spirit was upon his life! This reveals a clear connection between his intentional prayer life and daily intimacy with God! Do you see this connection in your life? Are you intentionally pursuing the Holy Spirit?

Now, as I mentioned because of Daniel's faith and abilities, his enemies were envious and hated him and wanted to get him killed so that they could rule. So, what did these enemies do? Knowing Daniel's unwavering faith and prayer life, they conjured up a phony law stating that everyone had to pray to the king for the next thirty days and if anyone didn't, they would be thrown into a lion's den! The king, blinded by their deceitful flattery, gave in to these enemies and signed the law. Only after did the king realize his horrible error! Take notice here...Daniel was known by what he intentionally did each day! He was known for his unwavering faith in God as shown by his prayer life. What are you intentionally doing TODAY? Does it reveal Christ to those around you? Does it reveal who your trust is in?

The story moves forward and after the law was signed, it says that Daniel "entered his house (now in his roof chamber he had windows open toward Jerusalem); and he continued kneeling on his knees three times a day, praying and giving thanks before his God, AS HE HAD BEEN DOING PREVIOUSLY." (Daniel 6:10) Could Daniel have simply waited the thirty days and put off prayer to tomorrow? Perhaps. Or he could have maybe closed the windows and not been as public about his faith during those 30 days. Sure, he could have done that. But why should he put of to tomorrow what is faithful and right to do TODAY?

Each of us is given TODAY. We could put off prayer to another time. We could put off being a witness for our faith to the next day. We can put off getting into the word. We can put off serving that person. We can put off and put off and put off. However, if we do this, what we are intentionally doing is putting God off to the next day rather than delighting in Him and serving him TODAY. Are you putting off the Lord to tomorrow or putting on the Lord Jesus Christ TODAY?

Take note that a crisis did not change Daniel's commitment to intentionally seek the Lord – nor should it change ours! Busyness should not get in the way! Laziness should not! Nothing should get in the way of our relationship with the Lord. So I ask again, what are you doing TODAY to intentionally grow closer to Christ? Is there anything more important than this? You and I know the answer to this is 'no' but what does our lives say?

I encourage you to consider your life TODAY. Don't put it off! What are you intentionally and purposeful building into your day (and each day after) that draws you closer to Christ? This may mean you need to intentionally reorder your day and even deliberately cut some things out. But is anything more important than fellowship with the Lord? Let us be a church, like Daniel, who pursues Christ TODAY and reveals Him as Lord!


