Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ,

This will be a November to remember. I think that goes without saying. Elections have consequences period. Regardless of the outcome on November 5th, there will be major consequences for the direction and future of our country. The results will affect our lives in ways we cannot

even begin to anticipate. But the most important things, the things that really matter, will not change one bit.

When you wake up on November 6^{th} , let me ask you to consider a few questions:

- 1) What will have changed about God?
- 2) What effect will the election have on the promises of God?
- 3) Does God still love me?
- 4) Does the blood of Jesus still cover my sin?
- 5) Does the Holy Spirit still dwell in me?
- 6) Has Jesus still prepared a place for me in heaven?
- 7) Is God still on the throne?

I could go on and on with more questions like these. Let me assure you that on November 6^{th} the answers to these questions will be the same as on any other day. Take a look at what God's word says in answer to each question listed above:

- 1) Nothing will have changed about God "<u>Jesus Christ is the same</u> yesterday, today and forever." (Heb. 13:8).
- 2) There will be zero change in the promises of God. All the promises of God are certain "for no matter how many promises God has made, they are "Yes" in Christ." (2 Cor. 1:20) No circumstance can alter or deter the promises of God!!
- 3) I say this emphatically: YES GOD STILL LOVES YOU!! Nothing in all creation whether it be the year 2024, an election, a virus, wars and rumors of war or any other life circumstance you have faced this year, NOTHING "will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord." Romans 8:39. (Rom. 5:8 too)
- 4) The work of the cross is finished. "We have been made holy though the sacrifice of the body of Jesus Christ once for all." Heb. 10:10. (Let's add John 3:16 too!!)
- 5) "Having believed [in the gospel of your salvation] you were marked in Him with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit." (Eph. 1:13)
- 6) "In my Father's house are many rooms; if it were not so, I would have told you. I am going there to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am." John 14:2-3
- 7) "To Him who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be praise and honor and glory and power <u>for ever and ever!...</u>Amen" (Rev. 5:13-14) Let me add Isaiah 40:15 & 28, "Surely the nations are like a drop in the bucket; they are regarded as dust on the scales...<u>Do you not know? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God</u>, the Creator of the ends of the Earth." God is on the throne. Always has been and always will be.

So as Jesus said, "Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." Press on for your faith is in Him. Love God! Love others! Imitate Christ! Be peacemakers and bridge builders! Ask for wisdom and the Holy Spirit daily! Pray for repentance in our great nation even as you live repentant lives! And GO and fulfill the great commission and make disciples, be the light, be the unity, be the reconciliation that we are called to be as bearers of the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Minutes from the September 16, 2024 meeting were approved as printed.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Received the September Summary Report by Month and the 2024 Budget Report to date.

- 5. Finalized details for the Soup & Salad Luncheon on November 3rd. Will be accepting a free will offering to cover the costs.
- 6. Completed a tentative schedule for the Kid's Fun Day in November.
- 7. Carols & Cookies will be held on Friday, December 6th at 7:00p.m. It is being organized by Deanna Hoffman and Gayle Denk.
- 8. Nursery has been staffed for several weeks. Yesterday was the first day that a parent used this service.
- 9. 69 people attended the Golden Gems luncheon. The total cost was \$563.12. Thank you to the Golden Gems for sharing their favorite scriptures. Thank you also to: everyone who attended worship and the luncheon, Pastor Mark and the children for recognizing the Golden Gems, to everyone who helped prepare for, set up and clean up, to Dave & JoAn Oatman for the paper flowers and to Rizzo's Restaurant for donating the salad.
- 10. Thank you to Brenna Mackall, Jane Shirk and Carol Reed for helping the Nurture Commission clean out the Aide Room on October 4th. Treasures that were found were set out in the fellowship hall for 2 weeks for members of the congregation to help themselves. A punch bowl was donated to Windber Woods. Anything not taken by the congregation was donated to Something Xtra Special and St. Francis Caring & Sharing in Davidsville.
- 11. Thank you to Lyric and Bella for recently serving as acolytes for the first time.
- 12. Please remember Pastor Mark and in his family during the month of October which is Pastor appreciation month.
- 13. Please remember Joe Denk as our College Student of the Month during the month of October.

WITNESS COMMISSION: Audrey Coleman

- 1. Many options for Christmas giving:
 - Samaritan's Purse boxes in entry, instructions provided.
 - Mitten, scarf and hat tree through Scalp Level Trinity Church. An annual event for Christmas giving. Note letter from Trinity on bulletin board regarding changes in coat donations going to Windber School children this year.
 - Tub will be out in November for Kuddle Korner. Needs are puzzles, 300 pieces or less, games and craft items. Ages are 5 to 12 for the kids. They are down to two puzzles at this time.
 - New Day Windber uses gift certificates for Christmas activities. They are in need of certificates, not to exceed 10 dollars for local businesses, such as Sheetz, McDonalds, Subway, Bella's, Dollar General.
 - Windber Woods sponsors the Gnome Tree for residents without family/friends to provide Christmas gifts. This should be started around Thanksgiving, more to come on dates for this option.

- 2. Tree in the back of the church was cut down for a cost of \$1,500.00. Purchased a pin oak tree for \$325.00 to be planted in the back of the church.

- 4. Received an anonymous donation towards the fellowship hall floor resurfacing in the amount of \$8,298.79. Also offered a \$1,000.00 donation to help with the project. The projected cost for the floor resurfacing is \$28,215.50. Between the Don Weaver Charitable Fund and the donations mentioned, there will be more than enough to fund the project.
