Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ,

In Sunday School, our class has been going through First Corinthians using the Right Now Media study taught by Pastor Eric Mason. Pastor Eric used a great illustration in the session on 1 Corinthians 12 where Paul teaches about unity in

the church and the value of each member's unique spiritual gifts given by the Holy Spirit.

Eric's illustration revolved around Lego's which I can very much relate to as a father of two boys who love Legos! When a kid gets a new set of Lego's, the set does not come put together but rather, every piece stands alone. All the pieces are there, and each piece is unique but left disconnected, it remains a scattered pile of seemingly random bricks and pieces that have nothing to do with one another. But fortunately, there is a book of instructions that comes with these Lego sets that guide you step by step in putting together the pieces so that they come together to become something awesome! On the cover of the manual is a picture of what the set will be, let's say for example, a Pirate Ship. All the pieces scattered around look nothing like a Pirate Ship but as one follows the instructions given from the manufacturer the image of a Pirate Ship begins to form as brick by brick, the pieces come together and become a Pirate Ship. Every brick will be used in this process of building and every piece is valuable to the finished product. No one part is more important than the other. Each Lego brick or special Lego piece has a crucial function and part to play in the final product. First Corinthians 12:4, 7 & 11-15 says:

⁴ There are different kinds of gifts, but the **same Spirit** distributes them.

⁷ Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good.

¹¹ All [spiritual gifts] are the work of one and the **same Spirit**, and He distributes them to each one, just as He determines. ¹² Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form **one body**, so it is with Christ. ¹³ For we were all baptized by **one Spirit** so as to form **one body**—whether Jews or Gentiles, slave or free—and we were all given the **one Spirit** to drink. ¹⁴ Even so the body is not made up of **one part** but of many. ¹⁵ Now if the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," it would not for that reason stop being part of the body.

All believers are connected together as one body because of Christ's gospel and the fellowship of the Spirit. The same Spirit has uniquely equipped every believer with spiritual gifts as He determines for the common good of the body. What does this tell each of us? **YOU ARE INCREDIBLY VALUABLE TO GOD!! JESUS HAS SAVED YOU AND BROUGHT YOU INTO HIS FAMILY! THE HOLY SPIRIT HAS UNIQUELY GIFTED YOU TO SERVE AND LOVE CHRIST'S BODY!!** In response, ask God in faith how He has called you to use your gifts in the body! From that prayer, step out in faith, get connected with His body and use your gifts!

Lastly, when all these parts come together, what is the image that is formed?? Remember the Lego pieces? When the unique parts come together, they form something greater that they could never have been on their own. When believers come together with each believer uniquely gifted by the Holy Spirit, we form the image of Christ. In this way, Christ is seen in our midst as we love one another and Christ is made visible to the world as they see Christ in our witness.

How has the Spirit gifted you? Where is God calling you to use your gifts in His body? Who do you need to connect with for the common good of the body and so that the image of Christ may be seen? Let us each by faith in Jesus come together in Him and not remain scattered. Together we form the image of Christ.

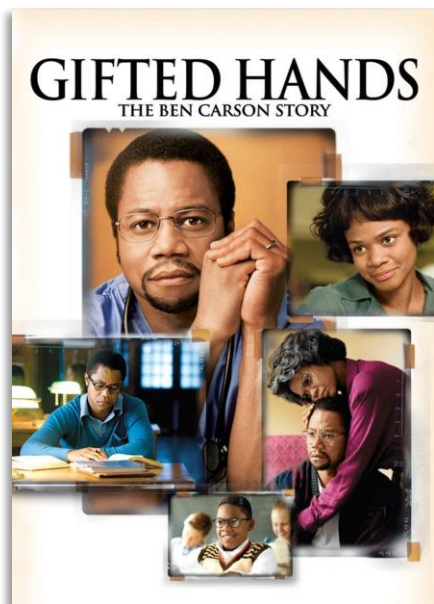


SUMMER MOVIE NIGHT

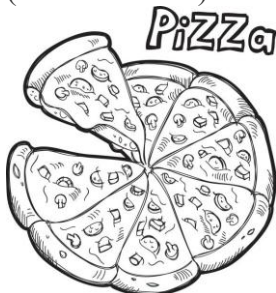
Summer Communion – Sunday, July 13th

Absent: Denny Hoffman and Amy O'Hara

Zach Denk called the meeting to order and Pastor Mark led us in prayer.

Minutes from the May 19, 2025 meeting were approved as printed.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Received the May Summary Report by Month and the 2025 Budget Report to date.

NURTURE COMMISSION: Norma Creager

1. Kindness Challenge for July is "Neglecting God".
2. Finalized the youth advisor job description and will be asking people to fill the position.
3. Children's Sunday School classes are combined for summer, 6/8 until 8/31.
4. Finished gifts discernment survey form and decided to wait until week of Sept 8 to distribute with a return date of 9/30.
5. Planning summer movie night for Friday, July 11 from 6:30-8:30pm in fellowship hall.
6. Katie Walker has agreed to finish Wanda's term on Nurture through 2027.
7. Golden Gems recognition will be held Sunday, 9/21.
8. Backpack Blessing Sunday is tentatively planned for 9/7.
9. 62 people attended the graduate luncheon on June 1. The cost was \$418.40. \$231 was collected from freewill offering. Thank you to Emily Hoffman for compiling the graduate information and preparing the Powerpoint. Thanks to everyone who helped serve, setup, clean up and to Carlyn's for the food. Thank you to everyone who attended to honor the graduates and to Pastor Mark for his words of guidance to the graduates.
10. Thank you to Suzy for Father's Day children's story yesterday and to Carl, Emmet and Piper for handing out beef sticks with scripture to the men of the church.

WITNESS COMMISSION: Dave Oatman

1. Reached out to Lou concerning tents for Praise in the Park. Last year the cost for tables, chairs and tents was \$700. This year will be \$770.
2. Precious Life bottles collection is done, but the donations have not been picked up yet.
3. Vacation Bible School will be held in August.
4. Bring a Friend Sunday will be 9/7.
5. Collection for hygiene kits will be held in September.
6. United Churches Faith Walk will be 10/12.

STEWARDS COMMISSION: Joe Denk

1. There was a plumbing issue at the parsonage which resulted in part of the basement being flooded. Cost for Roto Rooter to unclog the toilet was \$716. Cost to clean the basement and remove carpet and vinyl flooring was \$6,000. This will be turned into the insurance, but the deductible is \$5,000. New carpet, vinyl flooring and a vanity are needed. Scott and Pastor Mark will shop for the flooring later this week. Roto Rooter will come back at no charge to put a camera down the drain to see if there is any permanent clogging. This will be scheduled and completed before new flooring is installed.
2. A letter was drafted to Windber Woods that we intend to redo the parking lot on the side of the church in 2026 or 2027, and we are requesting they move their existing sewer line that runs under the parking lot out to the street.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. The Executive Committee discussed making committee/board meetings every other month or possibly changing the day/times of meetings each year to suit the current members. Committees could potentially meet at whatever time works for all members

instead of directly before the board meeting. Committees should think about these changes so that a plan can be set at the August meeting before the Nominating Committee reaches out to potential members in September.

2. Audrey Coleman has stepped down from the board for the rest of her term. Will send her a letter thanking her for her service. Witness will not replace her for the rest of this year but will let the Nominating Committee fill it for next year.
