Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ,

Irreducible Complexity...if this sounds complicatedly complex, that's ok! What do these two words mean?

Irreducible Complexity is the idea that describes how in a complex system, such as a machine, all the distinct individual

parts of that system must be present and in the right place for the system or machine to function. Still wrapping your head around this? Let me paint a picture for you: everyone knows what a mouse trap is. A mouse trap is a simple machine. It has five parts in order for it to work: 1) a base (small board) 2) a spring, 3) a hammer, 4) catch (which releases the hammer), 5) a holding bar (which holds the hammer). Now if you remove any one of these parts of the mouse trap, the mouse trap will not work and perform its purpose. Every part is needed in order for the task to be accomplished. Every part is valuable and necessary to the task. To take the analogy of the mouse trap a step further, every part of the mouse trap has been specifically made and formed by an intelligent designer who made each unique part and brought all the 5 parts together to perform a purposeful action.

In the body of Christ, God has saved and uniquely formed us in Christ and brought us together to be His church in order to purposefully live to glorify God, love one another and share Christ's gospel. As Ephesians 2:10 says, "For we are God's masterpieces created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we would walk in them." If you are in Christ, you are a masterpiece!! You are specifically created in Christ to be in His Kingdom and to contribute your unique spiritual gifts to the body of Christ. **Every member is needed and every member is valuable!**

As part of your uniqueness and value, it is the Holy Spirit who has specifically gifted you with spiritual gifts to minister and serve in the body of Christ (see 1<sup>st</sup> Corinthians 12:1-13, Romans 12:3-8 & 1<sup>st</sup> Peter 4:10-11). Everyone has different gifts by the Holy Spirit's design and when each believer comes together in His body desiring to serve, His purposes are accomplished and Christ's gospel is made visible. **Every member is needed and every member is valuable!**

The purposes for which God has called us in loving one another and sharing His gospel are complex and cannot be done by just one person. It requires the body of Christ coming together with each one using their spiritual gifts. **Every member is needed and every member is valuable!**

If you turn to the cover of this newsletter, you will see our church's purpose statement, vision statement, and core values that are all deeply rooted in Scripture. Living these out is not an individual effort but requires all of us coming together, relying on the Holy Spirit and contributing to the life of the church! **Every member is needed and every member is valuable!**


