Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ,

With the Christmas season winding up and the busyness of the season approaching, consider this passage when Jesus came to visit Martha and Mary:

"38 As Jesus and His disciples were on their way, He came to a village where a woman named Martha opened her home to Him. 39 She had a sister called Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet listening to what He said. 40 But Martha was distracted by all the preparations that had to be made. She came to Him and asked, "Lord, don't you care that my sister has left me to do the work by myself? Tell her to help me!"

⁴¹ "Martha, Martha," the Lord answered, "you are worried and upset about many things, ⁴² but few things are needed—or indeed only one. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her."

Christmas is busy and life is busy. This passage asks us: am I choosing what is better? It is not wrong to serve like Martha and there is a time for that, but in the midst of the busy and all that needs to be done to prepare for Christmas, can we make ourselves so busy that we forget to simply spend time with Jesus, listening to Him, worshipping Him, and fixing our focus on Him. After all, Christmas is all about Him, right? And yet we so easily get caught up in everything else – the lights, the music, the merriment, the traditions, the gifts – that we forget the greatest gift of all, Jesus! How can you choose what is better this Christmas? What will that look like for your life? What are some things that need to slow down or change for you and your family so that you can choose what is better? There are always things that do need to get done, but have we let in some extra busyness that squeezes out the time we need to spend with Jesus and seeking His heart, wisdom and presence in all things?

Now it is interesting to note that the passage right before Jesus visits Martha and Mary is Jesus' teaching on the Good Samaritan. In this story, the Priest and Levite pass by the man lying dead on the side of the road and do not help him due to various religious obligations and concerns for their own safety. However, the Good Samaritan chooses what is better! He stops to help the man, uses all of his resources to do so, and he commits a lot of his time to helping this man as he brings him to safety and even risks his own life in the process. So, choosing what is better does not mean inactivity. The Good Samaritan took action to save this man in the midst of his busyness. He held on to his schedule and activities loosely in order that he could do what was better. What opportunities will the Lord put in your path this Christmas to help others in His name? Will you choose what is better and act or miss the opportunity? Will you cling to your own activities or be open to what the Lord puts in your path as an opportunity to serve with Him? Pray and ask the Lord to open your eyes to see what He sees this Christmas so that you can choose what is better!

I do truly pray that you all have a merry Christmas as we celebrate our Lord and Savior's birth and the reason for which He came: to save us from our sins by dying on the cross and rising again. Join us for both Sunday School and Sunday morning worship throughout advent, for Carols and Cookies, for caroling, and for our Christmas Eve Candlelight & Communion service as these are all opportunities for you and your family to sit at the Lord's feet together, to worship Him as church family, and focus our hearts together on Him this Christmas and into the New Year.
