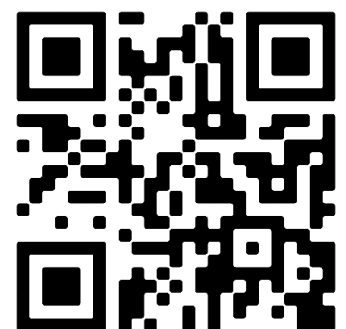

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ,

This year, I am going to take each month's pastor page to go through our core values and look to give all of us practical ways we can live these out in our life together as His church so that we may better fulfill our purpose of, "Linking young and old together to share the gospel and transform the world one life at a time."

Core Value #2: Fervent in Prayer: "Prayer is not the last step but our first step." – First Thessalonians 5:17, Luke 5:16

Oswald Chambers said, "We tend to use **prayer** as a last resort, but God wants it to be our first line of defense.

We **pray** when there's nothing else we can do, but God wants us to **pray** before we do anything at all."

First Thessalonians 5:17 says, "Pray continually." Our continual approach to all of life is prayer. This means that we live knowing that we are continually before the throne of God and have access to His presence and power in Christ by faith. Prayer is therefore the continuous declaration of our dependence and trust in God. Prayer is the joyful acknowledgment that He is sovereign and that all things are under His authority and control. It is our continual first step in all things because our Father loves us, hears us, and acts on our behalf.

Luke 5:16 tells us that. "But Jesus Himself would often slip away to the wilderness to pray." If Jesus as He walked this earth regularly got away to commune with His Father in prayer, then this ought to be our regular and first step of every day. This is the most important task of every day.

Next, let us consider our focus when we pray. The Lord's prayer begins: "Our Father, who is in Heaven, hallowed be Your name, Your kingdom come, Your will be done, on Earth as it is in Heaven." How easy is it to skip or gloss over this first part of the prayer and jump into laying out all of our daily needs and worries. We must not skip over how this prayer begins! Jesus directs us to start our prayers with worship of the Father, with recognition of His authority and holy character, and with heart alignment with His Kingdom and will. This is why prayer has to be our first step. If we enter any day, any decision without coming into alignment with the Father in prayer, we will end up walking in the dark and only demanding our will for our needs. Prayer is our first step and He must have the first place of worship in our prayers. Let our first step in prayer be to worship the Father and to joyfully surrender to His will.

What are some practical ways we can be fervent in prayer this year?

- Next time you tell someone you are going to pray for them, pray with them on the spot.
- Start a prayer journal and record how you see God at work in and through your prayers.
- Seek out someone in the church who can be your prayer partner and commit to either meet in person or call one another twice a month to share requests and pray together
- Pray daily for 1-2 people in your sphere of influence who do not know Jesus.
- Consider praying through the Lord's prayer each day for a month using each line as a prompt to focus your time of prayer.
- Prayerfully choose a separate Scripture verse for each of the following that expresses God's heart for these things: 1) your family; 2) our church; 3) our community; 4) our world; 5) your own life. Then pray those different scripture verses over these people.

What are some ideas that you may have to be fervent in prayer this year?

The Church Board met at 8:00 p.m. on February 16, 2026. The following members were present: Zach Denk, Katie Walker, Linda Walker, Dave Oatman, Amy O'Hara, Gayle Donelson, Scott Denk, Lionel Berkebile, Max Thacker, Denny Hoffman and Pastor Mark.

Absent: Nancy Abbott

Zach Denk called the meeting to order and Pastor Mark led us in scripture reading and prayer.

Minutes from the November 17, 2025 meeting were approved as printed.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Each Board member received the November 2025, December 2025 and year-end reports via email in December/January. Received the January Summary Report by Month and the 2026 Budget Report via email prior to this meeting.

NURTURE COMMISSION: Submitted by Katie Walker

1. February Kindness Challenge: "Love in Action"

The Nurture Commission is launching a February Kindness Challenge for the entire church. Rooted in *1 John 3:18*, this month-long focus encourages simple, meaningful acts of kindness. Each week will highlight a different theme: kindness at home, through words, toward others, and through prayer. All ages are invited to participate.

2. Easter Season Planning Underway

WITNESS COMMISSION: Submitted by Dave Oatman

1. Plan to develop a poster to post at BiLo (and other locations) as a way of promoting the church. Various information/events could include upcoming sermons, children's programs, bell choir, men's breakfasts, Wilderness Warriors, such as men's breakfasts, Wilderness Warriors, Praise in the Park, youth meetings. Could include service times, location, QR code, phone number... Poster could be updated and replaced periodically.
2. We will review Yacko Art for a possible event that would be open as an outreach. Yacko Art <http://yackoart.com> does art events in acrylic and watercolor. Terri Yacko was an art teacher for Johnstown Christian School for 11 years. Cost per person ranges from \$10 to \$20. We would need to evaluate what interest there is within the church (min of 5 persons) and there is a discount for 10 or more.
3. The tissue drive for the home has been completed. We typically have had a collection for Kuddle Korner in February however we have decided to move that to April where we have nothing scheduled and will break up asking consecutive months for donations.
4. Last year we had Bring a Friend Sunday pushed out later in the year. We felt spring was more appropriate for the event and will return the event to May. (date yet to be determined)
5. Praise in the Park 2026 was discussed. Zach has had contact with some churches/organizations who he thought might be interested in partnering with us however he has not had any positive response at this time. Speaking with Chuck a few months back he indicated we would have enough funds to hold the event this year however that would be as far as the funds would go. The Commission felt we could hold a final event for 2026 and if there was no further support then it would be the final Praise in the Park event.

STEWARDS COMMISSION: Submitted by Scott Denk

1. Refastened soffit on canopy ceiling in front of church.
2. Zach unclogged water fountain drain in fellowship hall.
3. Contacted Damian to replace relay and clean sound board.
4. One of the two furnace boilers started leaking. Mark Ott added stop leak. It is holding for now.
5. Stewards met with Mark Ott Plumbing on January 9th to get recommendations and pricing for replacement of boilers due to the fact that one of the current boilers needs replaced. The Stewards made a motion to switch the church heating system from oil to natural gas at a cost of \$41,524.34 with an additional tap fee for the gas line of \$2,027.00. The motion was seconded and discussion held. The motion carried.
6. Damian from Conemaugh Electronics determined that the PowerPoint projector wiring needs replaced. The cost to have it repaired is \$1,556.26.

DEACON REPORT: Denny Hoffman

1. The Deacons helped with the Christmas Eve Service. 94 people attended with an offering of \$1,050.35 which was deposited in the Deacon Fund.
2. Starting in January 2026 the Deacons will begin a new initiative to celebrate the lives of those members of our congregation that have been called home. In the fall of 2026 we will

hold a Service of Remembrance during a regular morning worship service and invite family and friends of church members who passed away to attend. We will continue to provide a funeral home Scripture & Prayer Service for all members of the church if requested by the family at the time of death. This new initiative is aimed at balancing modern funeral home trends and meeting the spiritual needs of the families in mourning while also acknowledging the baptismal vows of the deceased and their fervent belief in the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

3. The Deacons are organizing a schedule to have one prepared meal delivered to Shauntay and her family each week. Shauntay is undergoing aggressive, lengthy treatment for breast cancer. They are looking for volunteers to sign up for a specific week to bring a meal to the church which will then be delivered to Shauntay by the Madera family. An announcement will be made this Sunday during worship and will also be in the bulletin.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Mark

1. Thank you to the church for hosting the ECMen's Breakfast on Christmas Eve. The event went well with over 100 in attendance and a good gospel message was shared to encourage the men in their faith in Christ.
2. Met with Jim Hale to discuss We Bring Worship coming alongside our church to help develop and build a worship team. Jim will be here every other week on Sunday's and several from the church have expressed a willingness to be on the worship team and begin practicing with him.
3. It has been a challenging school year and also for the Windber community. I have continued to meet with the Windber Superintendent Mike Vuckovich for monthly prayer with a group of pastor's and the school has asked me to be available as a resource for pastoral care as needed to meet with students and staff.
4. Membership and Baptism classes will be held soon based on the schedules of those interested in joining the church.
5. Wilderness Warriors continue to meet and the ministry has been growing.
6. Liam has been doing a great job leading the ACTS29 youth group and they are looking to attend a concert at the end of the month, a conference in May and they plan to go to Sight and Sound in June.
7. The Men's group will meet for four Saturday's starting on Feb. 14 from 8:00-9:00 to connect for a short study and time in prayer together. All men are welcome.
